2014 Highlights

In addition to continuing our ongoing restoration efforts in the oak savanna. woodland and wetland environments, we broke ground on new learning gardens and developed curricula designed to teach children the joys and rewards of gardening and of being good stewards of the land.





We installed a paved handicapped accessible trail and constructed raised native plant and garden beds so that everyone could have the opportunity to experience nature first-hand. Now we can provide superior outdoor educational and recreational experiences for mobility-challenged visitors and improve the ecological balance of native flora and fauna.

While continuing to serve economically disadvantaged youth through our afterschool programs, Nature Nuts and Academy A.L.D.O. (Adventures in Learning & Discovery Outdoors), we were also able to provide nine homeless children with the opportunity to attend our summer camps at no cost. One mother wrote: "Thank you for the wonderful opportunity you

have given my children. Without the generosity of the scholarships provided for my kids, they might never have had the chance to explore nature and meet so many wonderful people (staff and fellow campers). Following on the success of our Run Wild in





the Woods at the Black Earth campus and our wackv-and educational-Brainiac Bowl trivia contest, we collaborated with the cities of Monona and Madison to launch a new free family event, Candlelight Snowshoe Hike. This event drew nearly 900 kids and adults to

our snow covered trails and to the campfire for a cup of hot chocolate to warm up. By providing opportunities for visitors to enjoy nature while participating in active outdoor pursuits, we strive to encourage a sustainable and healthy lifestyle.


