Accessible Nature Installations at ALNC

Next time you visit ALNC, be sure to explore our new trail features, made possible through a grant from the Madison Community Foundation and Dane County Partners for Recreation and Conservation, part of an ongoing effort to make nature accessible to everyone and share our love of the land!

Our new Phenology Garden at the Monona campus allows students and families to learn more about the land and Aldo Leopold's mission through phenology. Phenology is the study of nature's seasonal changes from year to year, such the first lilac bloom in late spring, the arrival of the monarch butterfly in early summer, and the departure of geese in the fall. Keeping records of these changes allows us to connect more deeply with the world around us and helps us to better understand the ecosystems we are a part of. The garden will serve as a living classroom where our visitors can observe and record information about native flora and fauna, as well as ecology and habitats.

A new Wetland Education Bridge has also been installed at the eastern edge of our pond, to enhance the wetland and prairie trail interpretive experience and expand recreational opportunities by better connecting our trail system. The construction of this bridge and the upcoming installation of an Accessible Nature Trail on our grounds will allow more visitors of all ages, interests and abilities to participate in our environmental programs and experience the beauty of our native habitats.
