## **FLASHING FIREFLIES**



There are about 2,000 different species of fireflies. Each one has its own unique flashing pattern, and some species don't even glow! Fireflies are a bioluminescent species, which means they can produce their own light. They blink at night to find a mate and to signal to possible predators that could be dangerous. To get a closer look at fireflies, we need to be respectful of them. For fireflies to have a good (temporary) home, we have to make sure there is enough air and moisture in the jar. Keep the fireflies in the jar for no more than 10-15 minutes, so they can safely return to their natural habitat.

## **MAKE A FIREFLY VIEWING JAR**

**Materials:** Canning jar, damp paper towel/coffee filter, grass and twigs, plastic wrap or paper, scissors

## **Directions:**

- 1. Wet a paper towel and wring out the excess water (it only needs to be damp). Place it in the bottom of a clear jar
- 2. Add some small sticks and grass clippings
- 3. Take plastic wrap or paper and place it over the top of the canning jar. Poke large holes with scissors or a pencil
- 4. Attach the top covering with the band from the canning jar
- 5. Enjoy watching the fireflies glow! But remember to release them back to where you found them after about 10 minutes
